



DÁITHÍ Ó hÓGÁIN MA PhD WERDHON/IRELAND



The Music - A distinctive sound with music that varies from traditional to original and the very lively. As well as harp strings you will hear mad fiddling, a lively guitar, bounding on the bodhran and manic mandolin playing - a sound that forces you to dance.

CD - Otitis Media, the groups first published in December 1998.

Background - The group was established in 1994 and continued after winning the competition for new folk/roots music groups in The Cnapan. They have been performing in The Big Session, Dolgellau; The Cnapan folk festival; The Nant Festival, Nant Gwrtheyrn; Carnafon



Castle; The Adelphi, Liverpool; The John Evans Festival, Waunfawr Venture and a few other taverns, halls, hotels, Eisteddfods. Also Welsh Channel 4 Craft Show, Theatre Gwynedd - with the Altan group, Radio Wales and a contribution on Sain's CD; The Best of Welsh Folk/Roots and the Best of Sain.

The Future - The group hopes to travel far, (is Bude far enough? ed.) and at this moment are working on/planning a new set. They are also hoping to produce a new CD this year.

KESCANA KERNOW/CORNWALL

Congress members who went to Glasgow last year will remember these. A group of girl singers who delight in singing traditional Cornish songs, some in English some in Cornish. They have been singing together for about ten years and much of what they sing is a result of their own research. Cornish folk song which is different to English folk song tends to be very melodious and the girls emphasise this in their singing.

MAIRI MAC ARTHUR ALBAN/SCOTLAND

Born and brought up in Lochfyneside in the County of Argyll Mairi has sung since childhood. She competed at her first Mod in Lochgilphead at the age of five. Her family and her Gaelic roots come from the Argyllshire island of Tiree.

Winning the National Mod Gold Medal in 1965 opened doors for Mairi. She received invitations to sing, not only in Scotland, England and Northern Ireland, but also in countries which otherwise she would not have been able to visit. These have included Canada, USA, Singapore, Latvia, Lithuania, Estonia and Russia.



Having visited Russia eight times the invitations to eastern countries have always been for Burns' celebrations.

Some years ago Mairi spent a very pleasant week in Port Erin, Isle of Man, as guest of the Celtic Congress. She looks forward to attending Congress in Cornwall.

CORMAC De BARRA WERDHON/IRELAND

Cormac comes from a family steeped in Irish traditional music and song. He studied harp with his grandmother, Róisín Ní Shé, and went on to study concert harp in the United States.

As a solo player, Cormac has represented Ireland all over the

world. He has performed for many heads of state and has made several recordings of traditional music with other members of his family.

He has given many concerts/recitals for harp duet with Anne-Marie O'Farrell.

He is also involved in music for theatre in Dublin, playing for productions of much of W.B. Yeats' work as well as being solo musician with the Irish Modern Dance Theatre. He is currently performing with singer Hazel O'Connor, in her much-acclaimed new show "Beyond Breaking Glass" which premiered at the Edinburgh Festival in 1998.



GAEL HAMON & ALWENNA COÏC BRETEN VYGHAN/BRITTANY

Gael Hamon and Alwenna Coïc were only 15 years old when they first sang in a concert in July 1998 in the "Gouelioù Meur Kerne" the Breton festival, one of the biggest in Brittany. They have been singing ever since in "festoù noz" all over Brittany. Gael and Alwenna are both studying in the Breton-medium "Lise Diwan" in Karaez.

THE GODREVY SINGERS KERNOW/CORNWALL

In 1994, several members of the group were approached with the question "would you like to entertain some old people in a nursing home in Truro?" From that day onward the Godrevy Singers have never looked back.

We entertain people less fortunate than ourselves - the disabled, the

elderly, the handicapped, the lonely and the hospital-bound. Today in fact, we have found ourselves so popular that we carry out more than 100 engagements each year - we just love to entertain whenever we can.

The ages of the ten members of the group range from 54 - 87, and we have a total of 611 years singing experience.

We sing unaccompanied and start our music with the use of a pitch pipe. Our repertoire includes a combination of Cornish Folk Songs and older-style tunes - all with a Cornish flavour in four part harmony.
